from the Parish Council Chairman

Springtime! I can hear the hurrahs echoing around the village after what seemed the longest, windy and particularly wet winter. At least we were spared the snow, and must be grateful we also avoided the misery of floods suffered elsewhere! I hope for another sunny summer this year and a chance to enjoy the pleasant activities we can pursue during the warmer weather. I am already busy sowing seeds and preparing my bedding plants in my greenhouse.


The annual Village Festival is the event that starts the Summer for me. Preparations have been going on since last year's Festival finished. Full details are published in the centre pages and I hope you will all support the various activities as much as you can. The Morris Men have invited a number of quite interesting teams for your entertainment. There is a concert of "classical" music and songs on the first Saturday which will be held in the Parish Church. The Parish Council are again arranging for a display of some of the photos from Bob Eady's collection as part of Festival week events: Wednesday 14th May in the Village Hall. Just wander in anytime between 7pm and 9pm. If you are a runner then get training for the usual Fun Run, which is also included in events.

The Parish Council work continues to be dominated by planning issues and we face applications that will threaten our village status. As I write this piece a Planning Inspector is holding hearings to evaluate the West Northants Joint Planning Core Strategy which includes 3500 houses on a so called Sustainable Urban Extension between Overstone and Moulton. We feel strongly this SUE, called Overstone Leys, is unsound with many flaws in the proposals but it will be up to the Inspector to decide whether or not it goes ahead. Your Parish Council has joined forces with all the neighbouring parish councils to fight this issue as hard as we can.

As well as that huge application we face developers making applications for estates of between 80 and 120 houses on sites within Moulton. The District Council failed to maintain an adequate 'land bank' for housing for years, and coupled with outdated planning policies this allows developers to mount successful appeals on refused planning applications. We have recently had one appeal turned down which went against the usual tide, but that is being challenged in the courts and a new application for the same site resubmitted! We struggle as you can see. Your parish council can only talk to developers to mitigate things by making sensible suggestions over benefits to be obtained for our village. I'm afraid as I've said before, we do not expect our District Council to provide much helpful protection from further large housing developments, and the County Council highways department also shows too little regard to our severe traffic problems in their responses on planning applications, but we are working with them to get better insights into Moulton's problems.

from your MP... Chris Heaton-Harris

The biggest issue which consistently dominates my postbag is local planning and I thought it might be worth me explaining how I deal with this issue.

Essentially, my influence as your MP is considerably limited in planning matters, owing to the fact that parliamentary convention dictates that Members of Parliament do not involve themselves in them. Indeed many MPs do not involve themselves in planning at all, but I am happy to make an exception to the rule in the event of a proposal involving more than ten dwellings and/or if there is very considerable local concern registered with me. The views of parish councils and the local district councillors also serve as an important barometer for me.

As I'm sure you can appreciate, I require this high level of concern to be demonstrated to me, otherwise I'd be involved in every planning matter in my constituency, however large or small.

Local planning policy is obviously very much a local matter and one which the local planning authority takes the lead on. However, back in January I hosted a meeting with the Planning Minister, Nick Boles MP, for parish chairmen. The purpose of the meeting was so those present could hear the Minister set out how neighbourhood planning should work. He said the real safety-net for local people comes with the adoption of a neighbourhood plan at parish level and a local plan, or in our case, the Joint Core Strategy at district level. These things make it difficult, although not impossible, for the Planning Inspectorate to ignore, when making decisions.

So, I regularly urge parish councils, where they can, to go down the neighbourhood plan route, in order to very clearly identify where housing is and isn't acceptable and to help fend off speculative planning applications. Once consulted and agreed upon by local people, this can be included in the wider local plan.

In recent weeks, I have been contacted by a number of residents concerned about different aspects of the "Overstone Leys" proposal and in light of the local concerns which have been raised with me, I have met with a number of residents. I've also spoken to representatives of Moulton Parish Council and your excellent district councillors and I will be working with them on your behalf on this matter going forward.

I would strongly advise that if you have concerns about this, you make the parish council and district councillors aware of them. I'd also appreciate it if you could copy me in on your letters and emails so I can stay on top of what is going on.

Moulton is a beautiful village and working together we can help keep it so.



Dear Moulton Scene Reader,

Moulton Sports Complex (MSC) closed its doors to most of its services on 31st March after well over two decades in operation. Whilst it will remain open to '*Clubs and groups*' on a '*block booking*' basis its primary function of serving the community with many different sporting and leisure initiatives will cease.

I have had eleven and a half happy years working at MSC, six of which as Manager. I have seen many changes as the Complex and its environment has evolved. We have been able to support many 'Community Groups' over the years, such as 50+ groups, Tea Dances, Fitness Classes, Roller Disco, Children's parties, Playscheme and not to mention the many Clubs and Associations that have been integral to the Complex and the Community. As the economic climate changed in recent years it was important to look for external funding providers. In the last six years we secured in the region of £100,000 to invest in the facility and equipment. Some of these providers included the NHS, Premier League, Local Councillors, Northamptonshire County Council, Daventry District Council, Police Authority to name a few. In 2013 we were awarded £50,000 from Sport England's 'Inspired Facilities' program which was set up as a legacy to the 2012 Olympics. It meant that we could develop all of our outdoor facilities.

I would like to take this opportunity after mentioning funding to thank Barry Care, Jane Austin and Moulton Parish Council. Not only with the letters of support with the funding bids but also the positive working relationship I believe we have always had, working under the same roof. We have always run special events and some initiatives in conjunction with each other and I have enjoyed working with you.

I would also like to thank my team of staff who have supported me in taking the Complex forward and the success of MSC and the

Off campus the College continues to play an important role in the local community. As an example the College has long established links with Moulton parish church. 

MOULTON'S WAR MEMORIALS

The 1st World War that began 28th August 1914 ended on 11th November 1918, when an Armistice was declared so that peace terms could be arranged. This took place in a railway carriage in the Forest of Compeigne. It was agreed that hostilities would cease at 11 am on that day. Tragically, hundreds of casualties occurred before that hour arrived.

In Flanders' fields the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row That mark our place: and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly.

We are the dead. Short days ago We lived, felt dawn, saw sunsets grow Loved and were loved, and now we lie In Flanders' fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe: To you with failing hands we throw The torch; be yours to hold high, If ye break faith with us who die We shall not sleep, though poppies grow In Flanders' fields. Those words were written by Colonel John McCree, Medical Officer with Canadian Army, in a trench during a lull in the action during the 1st battle of Ypres in 1915. Later, in May 1918, while lying on a stretcher in a hospital overlooking the English Channel, he is reported to have said:

"Tell them this, If ye break faith with us who die, we shall not sleep."

He died a few hours later and was buried in the beautiful cemetery above *Wimereux*.

And now the torch and poppy red Wear in honour of our dead. Fear not that ye have died for naught: We've learnt the lesson that ye taught In Flanders' fields.

That is the last verse of a poem written in response to Colonel McCree's, by an American lady, Miss Moina Michael. Two days before the Armistice, during the YMCA Conference of overseas War Secretaries, she was presented with a small gift of money with which she bought 25 red poppies. She wore one herself and the remainder were bought by the other secretaries. This was probably the first group selling of poppies. Then, the French Secretary, Madame Guerin, took things a stage further. She visited various parts of the world to suggest that artificial poppies should be made sold to help ex-serviceman and their dependants in need.

The first Poppy Day was held in Britain November 11th 1921.




Much of the above information was obtained from the website of the Shipston-on-Stour branch of the Royal British Legion.

I don't know when a branch of the British Legion was first established in Moulton. The existing Women's Section was formed in 1944 and therefore celebrates 70 years this year. Their pledge is 'Service not Self.' There is a photograph dated 1944 with a service officiated by the **Rev. Beech** with **Maggie Willis** kneeling holding the Legion standard in her hands. Also present is **Louisa Green**. The ceremony appears to have been held in the garden of the Telegraph Inn.

Moulton doesn't have a war memorial as a structure in the street. Instead we have **Memorial Plaques** in four places.

- 1. The Committee Room in the Village Hall was originally in the Manfield Hall.
- 2. Moulton Primary School. *'Roll of honour'* listing the names of all those old boys who fought in the 1st World War – plus those who died in action.
- 3. Moulton Parish Church. Lists the Deaths of those who died in both World Wars and Korea.
- 4. Moulton (Working Men's) Club which lists all those members who fought in World War II as well as those members who died in action.

Moulton Church Bell Ringers

July 19th 1795 was a special day in Moulton. Sidney Madge in his book Moulton Church and its Bells wrote the following about it all ...

"Hundreds of people, young and old alike, thronged the church, the churchyard and the *approaches thereto – some even climbing through* the wide gap that had been prepared in the walls surrounding 'Gods acre' to enable the tenor bell to begin its travel on the morrow. But the ringing was tinged with sadness, felt somewhat by all; for were they not losing what to them, in that village community, was part of their existence? Were they not losing too, what had so long shared their joys and griefs, their hopes and fears, and given strength and encouragement to them in despair? Ay, what had guided them from their youth, had daily aroused them from sleep, proclaiming the hour for work, the time for rest, and the benediction of their church. How oft, indeed, had they heard 'the solemn sound of the passing-bell, calling upon then all to offer a prayer for the departing soul of a neighbour – the death knell telling them all is over, that life's race is done – the funeral chime bringing clam in the midst of heart's grief – the joyful peal announcing a birth, baptism, or marriage.' They remembered, and were sad. But none of them felt it as did the ringers themselves: the parting to them seemed strange and unaccountable – affecting, as ringers alone know. Then the ringing ceased; and for the last time the Curfew tolled."

Moulton Bells have rung out in this village for some 700 years. Help keep up this wonderful part of our heritage by joining the local band or ringers. We practice every Monday evening from 7.30pm.

On Wednesday July 21st 1795 the old bells dating from as early as 1250 were sent off to the bellfoundry of E. J. Arnold in Leicester to be melted down to make a new ring of six bells. They were returned to Moulton on Saturday 24th October 1795.


Moulton Keep Fit

Additionally, due to people's generosity, we were also able to send 6 barrels of clothes, tools and household goods and have had enough money over to purchase a further 2 acres of land to be planted in the future.

The first 4 acres of trees have all been planted and are growing well. Access to schooling is so important to children if they are ever to get out of the cycle of poverty, but is only the first step. Our work to help this village help themselves will be ongoing.

Our church will, as usual, be open for refreshments and snacks and bric-a-brac on Festival Saturday. Last year, the money we raised was donated to the Northampton Hope Centre. This year we will be supporting the Air Ambulance.

Joan Waterfield passed away in King's Mill Hospital, Mansfield in December, aged 91. Joan and her late husband, Arthur, lived in Moulton from the 1940's until 1986, when she moved to Nottingham to live with her daughter, Vicki, Arthur having died suddenly in 1984.

Born in Nottinghamshire, Joan had three older brothers. She volunteered for the Women's Land Army early in the War and met Arthur at Moulton Agricultural College, as it was then. They were married in 1942 and their son Terry arrived in 1944, to be followed in 1947 by Vicki. The family moved to Moulton when Arthur began working for Boots the Chemists as technical adviser for farms and gardens. Joan was an active member of Carey Baptist Church and served as a Deacon. At her funeral service, her family and friends celebrated her long and full life. The family have arranged for a plague to Joan and Arthur in the gardens of the Crematorium and planted an oak tree for loan near Mansfield.

Jack Horn died in January in his 91st year. He and his younger brother, Ken, were born in Church Street to Hilda and Arthur Horn. Jack went to school in Moulton, leaving at 14 to be apprenticed at British Timken. He learnt to operate massive machines although apparently he was hopeless at changing light bulbs and plugs or even tuning a radio! He maintained that his distinctively loud voice developed when shouting over the machinery at Timken! As an engineer, his was a 'reserved occupation' but he helped the War effort as an ARP Warden in Moulton. Before the War he remembered seeing the R101 airship on a test flight over Moulton – in 1930 it crashed in France. Jack married Peggy Trasler in 1950 at Duston Congregational Church and in 1953 they moved to their own house in Dove's Lane, where they brought up their son and daughter, Chris and Ella. Jack took early retirement to look after Peggy, who sadly died in 1981. Although devastated by his loss, Jack made the most of 33 years of retirement with the support of family and the huge amount of friends he had made through his kindness to anyone in trouble. A devout Christian who lived his faith and a great believer in the power of praver, he was a regular attender at Carey Church. Jack's many interests included the Dalepak/ ChronNaps Table – he was a racing fan and punter and celebrated his 90th at Towcester Racecourse, as well as with a surprise party in the Lane, organised by neighbours - 300 turned up! A life-member of the WMC he and friends formed the Coffin Dodgers Knockout pool team and played regularly until recently. Jack had his own theories about home remedies advocating nutmeg, cinnamon and turmeric as cure-alls! Moulton will miss a lovable and happy character who leaves his son and daughter, 5 grandchildren and 1 great-grandchild with great memories.





Taxi Ranks

Taxi ranks are marked with a yellow bay marking and will have a sign to show when the restriction applies. Only hackney carriages will be allowed to wait in these areas and you should check the signs to see whether you can stop to load and unload within the rank.

Disabled Parking Bays

You must not park in parking spaces reserved for specific users such as bays reserved for Blue Badge holders unless you are entitled to do so.



Blue Badge holders are reminded to clearly display their blue badges when parking in disabled parking bays to avoid the risk of being issued with a ticket.



Check the signs

No parking on verges and footways

In some locations parking on the footway or verge may not be allowed and this will be signed by the yellow signs shown at regular intervals along a road.

Limited Waiting

A limited waiting bay will be marked out with a white bay marking and there will be a sign nearby which will tell you the times and days when the restriction applies. It will also tell you how long you can park for (e.g. 1 hour).



At the end of the permitted parking period you must leave the space and cannot return within the time period shown on the sign.

Waiting Restrictions

Double Yellow Lines

along the edge of the road, mean no waiting (parking) at any time.

along the edge of the road, mean you cannot wait (park) during the times shown on the sign.

Please note that yellow line parking restrictions apply to the whole of the highway on the side that they are marked, including any footway or verge. Therefore, parking on a footway or verge next to yellow lines can result in a parking ticket being issued.

Loading Restrictions

Loading Restrictions

are shown by yellow lines on the kerb, or at the edge of the carriageway. They indicate that loading or unloading is prohibited during the times shown on the signs.

Double yellow lines on the kerb mean no loading or unloading at any time. A single yellow line means no loading or unloading during the times shown.



Loading Bays

are white bays marked with the words 'Loading Only' and a sign with the white on blue trolley symbol. A sign will show the times when the bay can be used and whether loading and unloading is restricted to certain types of goods vehicles.
